Component A/B date change for May 2021

As the CCEB continues to monitor the evolving COVID-19 global pandemic and related public health restrictions, we have determined that it is in the best interest of all concerned to move the written components (A and B) of this upcoming administration to May 15, 2021.

Applications open on March 1, 2021. Please visit www.cceb.ca for application links and further information about the CCEB examination.

FAQ:

1. Why did you move the Component A and B examinations to a different weekend?

- The CCEB hopes to provide the broadest opportunity for candidates to elect to use remote proctoring for their upcoming examination while still providing an in-person option for those who are unable to meet the technical and environmental requirements related to remote proctoring.
- Eligible candidates may elect to attempt Components B and C during the same administration. This often means they are not able to choose remote proctoring as they are 'in transit' for the Component C examination and not able to meet the remote proctoring requirements.
- In moving Components A and B, the written components, of this administration to an earlier date, we hope to provide greater latitude for all written candidates to elect to use remote proctoring should that be their preference.
- In moving Components A and B of this administration to a different date, we reduce the total number of candidates present at any examination site, and reduce the scheduling challenges related to accommodating candidates who have elected to attempt Components B and C during the same administration.

2. Will this affect my eligibility in any way?

- No. Candidates who would have been eligible for May 29-30, 2021 will continue to be eligible for the May 15, 2021 written examination dates.
- In spite of this examination being conducted over multiple dates it is still one administration and as such eligible candidates may continue to apply for both Components B and C. You may review the Examination Eligibility Policy here: <https://cceb.ca/docs/Examination-Eligibility-Policy.pdf>

3. Why did you select Calgary for the in-person offering of Component A and B?

- At this time, Alberta does not have any prohibition on in-person testing provided:
 - The testing takes place in a facility that is permitted to be open, for that purpose.
 - Efforts are made to reduce the number of people who are required to be in person.

- The CCEB offices are located in Calgary and we anticipate having sufficient space to accommodate any candidates who elect to take their examination in-person.

4. Can I still choose to write my Component A or B exam on May 29-30, 2021?

- No. The written (Component A and B) portions of the upcoming examination administration have been moved to May 15, 2021.

Please note that information is provided based on the best and most current information available to the CCEB at this time. While the CCEB continues to attempt to reduce disruption to candidates, there are many variables that remain unpredictable and out of our control.
