Fall CCEB exam update to ALL Candidates, Volunteers and Stakeholders

In light of the dynamic COVID-19 global pandemic and related public health restrictions, the CCEB consistently monitors changing restrictions by jurisdiction. The CCEB had planned administrations in Calgary, Hamilton, and Montreal with an additional remote proctoring offering for Components A and B to be held this coming weekend (October 3 and 4). We have continued to prepare for the changing restrictions, including securing additional space and PPE to support a safe and secure exam administration.

As we have communicated previously, we have long understood that there was a possibility that public health restrictions would change to such an extent that we would not be permitted to test regardless of our extensive preparations and contingency.

Unfortunately, government announcements yesterday evening, September 28, 2020, regarding further restrictions in some regions of Quebec have forced us to cancel our planned Montreal administration. You can review the restrictions here:

At the time of writing, we continue to move forward at the Calgary and Hamilton sites under the same examination adaptations as have been previously communicated. Please visit www.cceb.ca and click on the red COVID button to learn more.

Additionally, we have worked diligently to prepare a contingency for the previously planned Montreal Component A and B examinations and are pleased to share that, in less than 24 hours, we have been able to secure the full relocation of that examination to an alternate site.

At the time of writing we are continuing to work towards a solution for the Component C administration.

What you need to know:

Candidates registered for **Calgary, Hamilton, or remote proctoring examination**: information sent earlier this month **remains unchanged**.

Candidates registered for the Montreal examination administration: we will be emailing you directly regarding changes within the next 24 hours.

We understand and share your frustration with this situation, and we are working tirelessly to minimize the impact on candidates.
